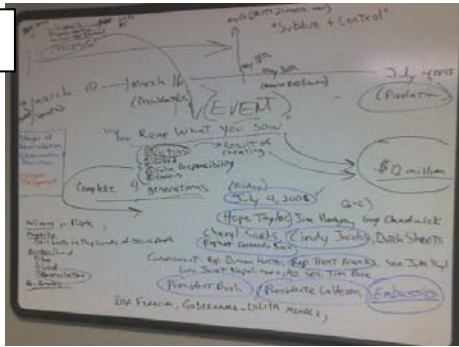


THE JULY 4, 2008 BORDER PRAYER EVENT

MEXICALI & CALEXICO REPORT

“The bride wrote the decree”

In the last six months of 2007, God began speaking and challenging the church of Mexicali and Calexico to unite in prayer and worship. They began to understand that God had given them a commission to help in transforming relations between Mexico and the United States.

In January of 2008, the founders of the Mexicali Apostolic Council met with Jon McHatton to pray and rightfully discern what God is saying through the prophecies that had been given to them by Hope Taylor, Cindy Jacobs, Chuck Pierce, and others.

The picture (1) that you see on the left is the result of that meeting. Specifically, a 40 year (4 generations) timeline of the enemy’s plan to destroy through generational curses and a strategy of redemption culminating in uniting at the border on July 4, 2008 and reaffirm the Treaty of Guadalupe Hildago, to reestablish the government of God at the border.

The council came agreed that this must be submitted to and agreed upon by the apostles of the United States of America. This proposal was given to Jon to bring back to the United States Apostolic Alliance for their wisdom and advice. When this was submitted to Hal Sacks, there was immediate agreement that this was of God.

The proposal was taken to the USAA and plans were soon underway to go to Mexicali and meet with the Apostolic Council. (Picture 2) During this meeting it was decided that Hal Sacks, Guy Chadwick, and Jon McHatton would host a meeting to unite the apostles of both nations, in the original Senate Chamber at the State Capitol of Arizona. California, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, and Oklahoma were represented along with the individuals from Mexicali who originated the vision.

After much prayer, work, and sleepless nights, the day finally came...the day the bride wrote the decree. Apostles from the US and Mexico, along with delegates from the Federal, State, and municipal government of Mexico, met in the civic municipal building on the Mexico side of the border, and reaffirmed and signed the treaty of Guadalupe Hildago with the corresponding prayer points. It was a joyous time of declaration, prayer, and excitement for what God has done and the new day of open opportunity that is ahead. Jose Cortez, and Sergio and Rosalva Resendiz, with the Apostles from the US, Jon McHatton, Hope Taylor, and Hal Sacks hold the signed documents in both Spanish and English. After the pictures and a brief time of fellowship and networking, the focus shifted to the US side of the border.

We realized later the correlation between Esther and what we had just experienced. In both scenarios, the bride wrote the decree affirmed by the government, which saved the nation to fulfill God's plan.

Kissed by God

The prayer on the US side of the border was one of the most powerful and immediately confirmed prayer times that some had ever experienced. Guy Chadwick had already called us and gave us his tremendous raise report of what God was doing in Tijuana and San Diego, which led to great rejoicing in the Mexicali and Calexico entourage.

We began to declare that the drug and human smuggling would stop and that the Holy Spirit would fill the border and confirm the treaty. (picture 5) While this was going on the shofar was blown from the Mexico side, right by the immigration and border authority office.

As we were finishing praying, there was a man who came and said that he needed God. He began telling us the story of his life and experience (picture 6). We realized that this man almost embodied the very things that we were declaring to end. We all gathered around him and began to declare the beginning of new life and liberty. This again was what we had just declared in prayer over the border.

The man was led in a wonderful prayer of repentance and asked Jesus to come into his heart and life. The man became astonished when he said that simple prayer and peace filled his heart. Almost immediately the man's eyes opened very wide and he began to speak in an unknown language.

Just as we had prayed that the Holy Spirit would sovereignly fill the border, the Holy Spirit filled this man, without any education, training or even asking. Truly we felt that God had come and kissed us with His presence, anointing, and approval.

That night (picture 7) we had a Holy Ghost Fiesta in one of the local Mexicali Churches. Many Churches from both sides of the border, came together to celebrate the goodness of God. The mission was completed, but the job has just begun.

The following day the Apostolic Council and the US Apostles met together for a spiritual debriefing. We continually heard that nothing like this has ever been done before. We also heard how that God had changed the hearts of some of the leaders. (pictures 8, 9)

We were in awe when some of the pastors repented as they shared judgments that they had learned and held all their lives regarding the issues surrounding the Treaty and the border.

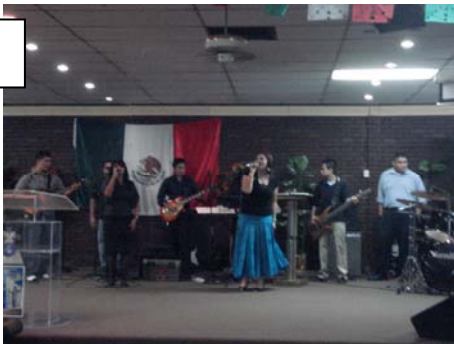
