

NEW MEXICO BORDER PRAYER REPORT – JULY 4, 2008

TO: Members of the Border Prayer Initiative

FROM: Apostle Jack Webb, Destiny Church of Albuquerque

SUBJECT: New Mexico Border Prayer Initiative Report —4 Jul 08

PURPOSE: To carry out the mandate given to Apostle Jack Webb, Destiny Church of Albuquerque, by The Border Prayer Initiative.

Teams were created in order to cover New Mexico's three ports of entries; Antelope Wells, Santa Teresa, and Columbus/Palomas. Prior to travel to the locations, there were prayer team gatherings seeking God's wisdom and revelation on how New Mexico's border crisis could be handled by natural man- First in the Spirit through dominion prayer for this initiative, then the natural result. During these preparation prayer sessions, we declared a spirit of reconciliation and love would flow through us for our neighbors. Each team member was furnished copies of The Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo, a map of the area used for the negotiations in 1848, along with declarations and prayer scriptures for our borders. Each team member was given information on "Making Decrees to Activate the Heavenly Court" including prayers and scriptures for reconciliation, restoration and peace for prophetic declarations. Also, each team was given water, oil, salt, grape juice and wheat seed to be poured out at all locations. This included scriptures for the elements. Teams also took communion at their locations. Included are the border initiative reports.

We have tried to send as much as possible by e-mail but will send the total report by hard copy along with Light the Highway report of December 2007. As you will see, we have already had answered prayer in New Mexico from this prayer initiative.

Border Prayer Initiative - Palomas Mexico and Columbus New Mexico Border Date: 7-4-08

Prayer team: James & America Sisneros, Destiny Church of Albuquerque - Mary Ochoa, Lynda Simmons, and Anne Marie Beck; Deming NM

Purpose: Pray God's will be done on the borders.

Saint Death

On July 2, 2008, 1 (James) was led by the Lord to do a study on the patron saint Santa Muerte "Saint Death" who is being worshiped by drug dealers, thugs, and the Mexican cartels. These idol worshipers have shrines built for saint death and paint the saint different colors for different helps; for example, the all black saint is for power and authority, the gold is for prosperity, green for luck, blue for good health, white for family and protection, and red is to gain favor. Not only are the petitions brought to this saint but also offerings are placed at her feet. One may ask what kind of offerings. Well how about some tequila and cigarettes. WHAT!!

The first day of every month the streets are packed in parade form to give praise and thanks to saint death that protects and provides for them. All generations and cartels in unity confess this. The worship of saint death is widely accepted throughout Mexico, but is huge at border cities having shrines set up at exit points of borders. Border agents say when apprehending illegal crossers, they have found many have tattoos of saint death or little pocket statues of her.

History of Palomas

Once we arrived, we approached two border agent vehicles. We had the opportunity to explain our purpose and also the prayer initiative taking place on both sides of the borders in New Mexico, Texas, Arizona, and California. We asked their permission to pray on the vacant dirt lot in front of the border fence. One agent explained he needed to call his supervisor; and as he made the call, the other agent told us about existing problems on both sides. He shared with us that the Palomas border was the busiest for illegal crossings with the attempt to traffic both drugs and firearms. He then explained the murder rate in Columbus/Palomas; a total of 47 as of July 4, 2008. The agent told us of a shooting that led to murder on July 2, 2008. There were 3 men traveling in a car when two other cars intercepted them. The 3 men were fatally shot with 40 bullets from high power rifles. Both parties were said to be part of a drug cartel. This murder was thought to be a revenge killing from back in May when 7 men were killed. It is reported this killing was the 2500 in Mexico for drug and gang related violence. The agents were thanked you for all they were doing.

Time for War

After communion we moved into our prayer location about 25 ft. from the fence and about 50 ft. from the entry. We began by worshipping the Lord. As we worshiped, the Lord gave America a verse from Jeremiah 33:3 "Call unto me, and I will answer thee, and show thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not". We asked God to show us the hidden things that lay open before Him. Leviticus 26:40 was read. "If they shall confess their iniquity, and the iniquity of their fathers, in their unfaithfulness which they have committed against me, and that also they have walked contrary unto me". This led to confession of sins and the sins of our fathers that were against God and against man both Mexican and American. We confessed our belief that God's will was in the original treaty of Hidalgo. We confessed our sins for breaking this treaty. Having worshiped and repented we agreed the atmosphere had been set for spiritual warfare. Time was taken to declare our authority over the spirit of death, spirit of witchcraft, poverty, and the spirit of fear, and making declarations over Palomas and the borders.

Declarations Made

1. We declared the prince of peace would enter Palomas and fill the void of the spirit of death. Isaiah 9:6
2. We declared the body of Christ in Palomas would be baptized a fresh with the Holy Spirit and preach and proclaim the gospel of the Lord Jesus with all boldness.
3. We declare the church in Palomas had the power to get wealth and will establish God's kingdom in Palomas. Deuteronomy 8:18
4. We declared all drug trafficking would stop and all underground tunnels would collapse.

Prayer Points

1. God's will to be done.
2. Safety for border agents and Mexican police.
3. A stop to illegal crossing
4. Against poverty and poverty mind set
5. Against trafficking of both drugs and firearms
6. A stop to violence
7. Against the spirit of death
8. Against the spirit of fear
9. Pray for the church in Palomas
10. Pray for a fresh move of the Holy Spirit
11. Pray for the Mexican government
12. Pray for the American government
13. Pray against the move of cartels

Prophetic Act

We dug a shallow hole and poured grape juice on the bottom declaring the blood of Christ who gave us the authority to pray. We declared a cleansing of the land. We then placed seed on top and declared a seed of harvest for the Lord. The oil was then poured with declaration of a new anointing. Water was on top with a declaration of a move of the Holy Spirit upon the lands; salt was poured out as we declared it would preserve our prayers. The hole was then covered. We poured grape juice on top sealing all things with the sweet blood of Jesus.

Dream

After returning home that day I (James) took a nap. Seconds before waking up, I had a dream. I was praying in the same location and a bird appeared below me. This bird was missing feathers; and the feathers he did have were short and dirty. This bird was missing an eye and one of his legs was broken. As I prayed, the bird was turning in circles. Once I said amen, the bird did a complete turn. He had all its feathers and no longer was missing an eye. His leg was healed. He then flew away to the Palomas side. Once I awoke, God spoke to me that our prayers were being answered; but we must continue to pray and make declarations. We would see a city that was broken, dirty, poverty stricken and lacking changed into a city of overflow and cleansed with the presence of the Lord. Amen. All glory to the most high God.

Guilty plea in cross-border arms trafficking case

PHOENIX (AP) - A 23-year-old New Mexico man has pleaded guilty to one count of fraud and one count of forgery in a major arms trafficking case in Arizona.

Attorney General Ferry Goddard says Victor Varela of Columbus, N.M., entered the plea Thursday in Maricopa County Superior Court. According to court documents, Varela fraudulently purchased through a confidential informant two .50-caliber rifles for more than \$6,700 in September. The attorney generals office says Varela also sought to purchase several

handguns and attempted to purchase a fully automatic M-60 machine gun for \$30,000. Several weapons connected to Varela were traced to crimes committed in Mexico by drug cartels. Varela faces sentencing Aug. 2. He could get up to 2½ years in prison and seven years of probation.

Three men killed in Palomas; police blame drugs

DEMING, N.M. (AP) - Three men have been fatally shot in the Mexican border town of Palomas in what authorities say is an ongoing turf war among drug cartels.

The Luna County Sheriff's Department identifies them as 32-year-old Lauro de Hierro Apodaca, 26-year-old Joel Abel Treviso Acosta and 24-year-old Rigoberto Rubio Chavez. Authorities say they were in a car intercepted by two vehicles whose occupants fired assault rifles Monday. Investigators found 40 shell casings at an intersection in Palomas, which is across the border from Columbus, N.M. Authorities say they believe the three deaths are related to the slayings of seven men in early May. More than 2,500 people have died across Mexico this year in crime and drug-related violence. In March, the Mexican government deployed more than 2,500 soldiers and federal police to Chihuahua.

Antelope Wells Team Report

An atmosphere of prayer, praise, and worship was established as we traveled to our destination. We felt worship is a key to dethrone false gods and to push back the enemy. Our objective is to raise a battle cry for strongholds to be broken so the presence of the Lord would be established throughout the miles of New Mexico's borders. Isa 37:16-17 "O Lord Almighty, God of Israel, enthroned between the cherubim, You alone are God over all the kingdoms of the earth. You have made heaven and earth. Give ear, O Lord, and hear, open your eyes Lord, and see..." We realize we truly have a window of opportunity to bring peace and reconciliation between our two countries. Only through our pursuit of God can we bring His favor and His kingdom to earth. We declared a shaking/hovering on both sides that would bring about an invasion of Holy Spirit with three levels of sound: history/present/future with expectation, excitement of the power of His visitation and advancing Glory. Declarations for destroying of veils that set reproaches in motion and blocks entry ways was carried out. There were border patrol vehicles traveling off road patrolling these distances. Apostle Webb pulled off the road on occasion to speak to these patrol agents. He explained what we were doing in this remote area, thanked them for their service, and informed them they would be in our prayers. These agents were very receptive to hear someone was concerned. We asked God for His love to be poured out over all Mexico and repented of abuse of the land where the United States had been involved and repented that we had not been the neighbor we should have been showing Gods compassion for the people; with greed and injustice in both countries taking advantaged of the poor. We dug a shallow hole near the sign of Antelope Wells and as we poured the grape juice, oil, wheat, salt and water, there were declarations of the precious blood of Jesus. The team took communion before leaving the area.
